As February 2010 drew to a close, Military Sealift Command remained a prime mover in the larger Operation Unified Response to Haiti for humanitarian aid to the victims of the January earthquake.


Our hearts go out to Haiti's millions of victims, and we remain committed to providing timely assistance as Haiti recovers from this disaster.
